



## Marjorie Klinger

July 17, 1922 - November 24, 2019

Marjorie Ella Klinger, 97, of Hickory Corners, passed away on November 24, 2019, at the Manor Care, Sunbury. She was born at her home in Hickory Corners on July 17, 1922, a daughter of the late Gertie (Bingaman) and Charles Lehman.

After graduating high school, she worked as a housekeeper/nanny in Sunbury for Judge Carl and Lillian Rice and their children Fritz and Susie. She was married at age 23 to Lee P. Klinger on June 23, 1945. She worked in the school food service at Dalmatia Elementary School, now Line Mountain School District. She was skillful at crocheting, cooking and baking. She liked word search puzzles and playing Bingo, most of all she loved the Lord and her family. Marjorie was a Cub and Boy Scout leader, later a Brownie and Girl Scout leader in the Dalmatia area, a member of Hickory Corners Fire Company Ladies Auxiliary, and Saint Paul's UCC, Urban, for 82 years.
