Marlin D. Troutman, 95, of Berrysburg, passed away on January 18, 2024, at the Polk Personal Care, Millersburg. Born September 28, 1928 to Elsie and Joy Troutman of Jordan Township, Marlin was the 6th of 11 siblings. Marlin spent his early life working on the family farm before meeting and marrying Arlene A. (Klouser), his wife of 51 years. They moved to Berrysburg Borough where Marlin remained a resident for 68 years.

Marlin was an active resident of Berrysburg; a member of the Berrysburg Fire Company and Borough board member for 50+ years. In 2002 Marlin was recognized by the Pennsylvania State Association of Boroughs for his years of dedicated service. In 1993 he retired from Brubaker Tool Corp after 51 years of employment. Marlin was also active with many charitable organizations such as Kiwanis and Tall Cedars. He was a member of Peace United Church of Christ, Berrysburg.

Marlin was preceded in death by his parents, Elsie and Joy Troutman, his wife, Arlene (Klouser), and their daughter Beverly A. (Ramberger).
