Resta G. Deppen, 92, was called home to be with the Lord on January 14, 2023, at Bethany Village, Mechanicsburg, PA. She is survived by her husband of 71 years, Richard Deppen, a son, Reuel Deppen and his wife Christine Wnuk of Harrisburg, a brother in-law, and many nieces and nephews. Brothers Dean, Fairvan, Doyle, and sisters Myra, Rema, and Nancy all predeceased Resta.

Born March 7, 1930, on Sunnydale Farm near Dalmatia, PA, she graduated from Lower Mahanoy Twp. High School and attended Mansfield State Teachers College. She worked for the military at the Olmsted Military Base and for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania prior to being a homemaker.

Resta would strike up a conversation with just about everyone. She enjoyed being with family, especially at Sunnydale with her mother and sisters. After residing in Gratz, Pennsylvania, Richard and Resta moved to Progress, Susquehanna Township in Harrisburg where she regularly visited with friends and neighbors.

Resta was baptized, confirmed and married at the Stone Valley Church, Dalmatia, PA and then became a member of St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Harrisburg, PA where she worshiped for 56 years. One of her favorite St. Mark's activities was the annual flea market where she assisted at the

jewelry stand.
